RULES.

1.—All events start from scratch.

Class A events for boys under 13 years.
Class B ,, ,, 14 years.
Class C ,, ,, 15 years.
Class D ,, ,, 16 years.
Class E open Championship events.

Ages taken are those on 31st July, 1935.

- 2.—A competitor in Class B may enter in Class C, and a Class D competitor in Class E, for the Cricket Ball, Long Jump and High Jump. But a competitor in Class A or D may not enter for more than three events.
- 3.—No competitor is allowed to enter for more than three running events, and no more than five events in all.
- 4.—All events, except the Old Boys' Race, count for the House Championship.
- 5.—A first place counts 3 points, second 2 points, third 1 point.
- 6.—The House with the highest aggregate of points wins the Athletic Championship Shield.
- 7.—Each House may enter three competitors for each event. Preliminary heats reduce the second and third strings to two to compete with the first strings on Sports Day.
- 8.—The competitor with the highest aggregate in Class E holds the School Championship Cup for one year.
- 9.—The competitor with the highest aggregate in Class C holds the "Temple-Cole" Junior Cup for one year.
- 10.—Every competitor must wear his number back and front, as well as an inch ribbon of the distinctive colour of his House from the neck (4 ins.) and along the seams of his shorts.
 - 11.—Spectators are not allowed on the course.
